Population and Housing Narrative Profile: 2011

2011 American Community Survey 1-Year Estimates

Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.


Households and Families

In 2011 there were 192,000 households in Sedgwick County, Kansas. The average household size was 2.6 people.

Families made up 64 percent of the households in Sedgwick County, Kansas. This figure includes both married-couple families (46 percent) and other families (18 percent). Of other families, 8 percent are female householder families with no husband present and own children under 18 years. Nonfamily households made up 36 percent of all households in Sedgwick County, Kansas. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

In Sedgwick County, Kansas, 34 percent of all households have one or more people under the age of 18; 22 percent of all households have one or more people 65 years and over.

Among persons 15 and older, 51 percent of males and 47 percent of females are currently married.

In Sedgwick County, Kansas, 11,000 grandparents lived with their grandchildren under 18 years old. Of those grandparents, 36 percent of them had financial responsibility for their grandchildren.

Nativity and Foreign Born


Ninety-one percent of the people living in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011 were native residents of the United States. Sixty-four percent of these residents were living in the state in which they were born.

Nine percent of the people living in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011 were foreign born. Of the foreign born population, 40 percent were naturalized U.S. citizens, and 59 percent entered the country before the year 2000. Forty-one percent of the foreign born entered the country in 2000 or later.

Foreign born residents of Sedgwick County, Kansas come from different parts of the world.

Language


Among people at least five years old living in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011, 14 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 63 percent spoke Spanish and 37 percent spoke some other language; 40 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."



Geographic Mobility

In 2011, 84 percent of the people at least one year old living in Sedgwick County, Kansas were living in the same residence one year earlier.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011




Education

In 2011, 27 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 29 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Eleven percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Sedgwick County, Kansas was 141,000 in 2011. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 17,000 and elementary or high school enrollment was 87,000 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 37,000.

Disability

In Sedgwick County, Kansas, among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in 2011, 12 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 3 percent of people under 18 years old, to 10 percent of people 18 to 64 years old, and to 40 percent of those 65 and over.

Employment Status and Type of Employer


In Sedgwick County, Kansas, 62 percent of the population 16 and over were employed; 31 percent were not currently in the labor force.

Eighty-three percent of the people employed were private wage and salary workers; 13 percent were federal, state, or local government workers; and 4 percent were self-employed in their own (not incorporated) business.



Commuting to Work

Eighty-six percent of Sedgwick County, Kansas workers drove to work alone in 2011, and 9 percent carpooled. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 18 minutes to get to work.


Percent of Workers 16 and over Commuting by Mode in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011



Income


The median income of households in Sedgwick County, Kansas was \$49,478. Twelve percent of households had income below \$15,000 a year and 5 percent had income over \$150,000 or more.

Eighty-one percent of the households received earnings and 16 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-six percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$17,212. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.


Proportion of Households with Various Income Sources in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011



Poverty and Participation in Government Programs

In 2011, 15 percent of people were in poverty. Twenty-one percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 8 percent of people 65 years old and over. Eleven percent of all families and 29 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

Poverty Rates in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011




Health Insurance

Among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011, 86 percent had health insurance coverage and 14 percent did not have health insurance coverage. For those under 18 years of age, 6 percent had no health insurance coverage. The civilian noninstitutionalized population had both private and public health insurance, with 69 percent having private coverage and 26 percent having public coverage.

Population

In 2011, Sedgwick County, Kansas had a total population of 501,000 - 254,000 (51 percent) females and 247,000 (49 percent) males. The median age was 34.5 years. Twenty-seven percent of the population was under 18 years and 12 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011




For people reporting one race alone, 83 percent were White; 9 percent were Black or African American; 1 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native; 4 percent were Asian; less than 0.5 percent were Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 4 percent were Some other race. Five percent reported Two or more races. Thirteen percent of the people in Sedgwick County, Kansas were Hispanic. Seventy- percent of the people in Sedgwick County, Kansas were White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

Housing Characteristics

In 2011, Sedgwick County, Kansas had a total of 213,000 housing units, 10 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 75 percent were in single-unit structures, 21 percent were in multi-unit structures, and 4 percent were mobile homes. Twenty-nine percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

The Types of Housing Units in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011




The median number of rooms in all housing units in Sedgwick County, Kansas is 6. Of these housing units, 60 percent have three or more bedrooms.

Occupied Housing Unit Characteristics

In 2011, Sedgwick County, Kansas had 192,000 occupied housing units - 126,000 (66 percent) owner occupied and 66,000 (35 percent) renter occupied. Seventy- percent of householders of these units had moved in since 2000. Sixty-nine percent of the owner occupied units had a mortgage. Three percent of the households did not have telephone service. Six percent had no vehicles available and another 21 percent had three or more.

House heating fuel used in Sedgwick County, Kansas in 2011



Housing Costs

The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,202, nonmortgaged owners \$433, and renters \$692. Twenty-five percent of owners with mortgages, 12 percent of owners without mortgages, and 47 percent of renters in Sedgwick County, Kansas spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.

Explanation of Symbols:

1. An '***' entry in the margin of error column indicates that either no sample observations or too few sample observations were available to compute a standard error and thus the margin of error. A statistical test is not appropriate.
2. An '-' entry in the estimate column indicates that either no sample observations or too few sample observations were available to compute an estimate, or a ratio of medians cannot be calculated because one or both of the median estimates falls in the lowest interval or upper interval of an open-ended distribution.
3. An '-' following a median estimate means the median falls in the lowest interval of an open-ended distribution.
4. An '+' following a median estimate means the median falls in the upper interval of an open-ended distribution.
5. An '****' entry in the margin of error column indicates that the median falls in the lowest interval or upper interval of an open-ended distribution. A statistical test is not appropriate.
6. An '*****' entry in the margin of error column indicates that the estimate is controlled. A statistical test for sampling variability is not appropriate.
7. An 'N' entry in the estimate and margin of error columns indicates that data for this geographic area cannot be displayed because the number of sample cases is too small.
8. An '(X)' means that the estimate is not applicable or not available.
