Rhyming Activities

I would point out rhyming words as I read. There are a lot of rhyming words in this book...starting with the title.

Then I would pick a couple of easy rhyming endings and do matching or grouping activities with those. My choices would be –at words, -ings words, -ay words, or –ow words.

Make picture cards with words that rhyme and play a game like “Go Fish” with the child saying do you have a word that rhymes with Bat, and he asks someone if they have a Cat he has a pair. Or you could make it harder and they have to find all four –at words to make a set. You can play concentration also.
