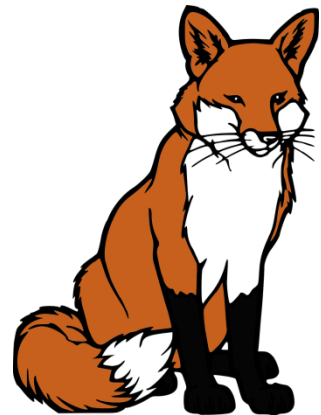
Activity 2

One famous fictional animal is Mr. Fox from Roald Dahl's *Fantastic Mr. Fox* (25380). Foxes are extremely clever. They use their larger ears to help hunt for food.

Try being as clever as a fox in this Fox and Mouse game.

Instructions

Have a group of friends – at least four – stand in a circle. Pick one person to be the fox and have them stand in the middle of the circle with their eyes closed. Have one of the people in the circle be the mouse and walk around the inside of the circle around the fox, then return to their place. The fox must try to guess who the “mouse” was, using sounds as clues. If the fox guesses correctly, the mouse takes a turn as the fox.
